## Back to School Safe Driving Tips

Over the next couple of weeks children everywhere will be headed back to school. There is nothing more important than the safety of our kids. Now is a good time for drivers to review some important safety tips:



- Leave early and allow extra driving time.
- Slow down and stay alert in school zones.
- Stop for all buses when flashers are on.
- Stay alert and watch for children.
- Reduce distractions by putting cell phones away.
- Pay attention in school loading and unloading zones.
- Use mirrors and look around you before backing up.

Remember, you never know what children are going to do and they probably are not thinking about traffic. In addition to driving safe, parents should also talk to their kids about [traveling to and from school](#) safely.

## Reducing Lead Limits in Toys

In July, the [U. S. Consumer Product Safety Commission \(CPSC\)](#) voted to move forward with [lead content reduction in toys and other children's products](#). Lead is a heavy metal that is toxic for children, and associated with lowered levels of learning, impaired hearing, brain damage and, at high levels, can be fatal. The new total lead content limit **goes into effect on August 14th** for manufacturers, importers, retailers and distributors of children's products. This ruling is retroactive and will apply to products already produced and currently in the market place.

The [Consumer Product Safety Commission \(CPSC\)](#) product safety complaint database, [SaferProducts.gov](#), that helps keep U. S Consumers safe by keeping unsafe toys and other dangerous products off the shelves, may soon be a victim of [budget cuts](#), according to [Inez Moore Tenenbaum](#), Chairman of the CPSC. ## Child Passenger Safety Week

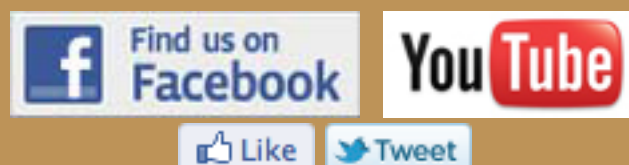
